



Phil. 1:27 Only conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ so that whether I come and see you or remain absent, I will hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel; 28 in no way alarmed by *your* opponents—which is a sign of destruction for them, but of salvation for you, and that too, from God. 29 For to you it has been μόνον το είς αύτον πιστεύειν granted for Christ's sake, not only co believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake, 30 experiencing the same conflict which you saw in me, and now hear *to be* in me.

"For this finds favor, if for the sake of conscience toward God a person bears up under sorrows when suffering unjustly. For what credit is there if, when you sin and are harshly treated, you endure it with patience? But if when you do what is right and suffer for it you patiently endure it, this finds favor with God. For you have been called for this purpose, since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His steps, WHO COMMITTED NO SIN, NOR WAS ANY DECEIT FOUND IN HIS MOUTH; and while being reviled, He did not revile in return; while suffering, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting Himself to Him who judges righteously;" (1Pet. 2:19-23, NAS95S)
